> \$1 Million Ready for West Virginia Tourism Businesses The Progress Fund and USDA financing new, growing enterprises

Greensburg, PA – May 1, 2007 – Entrepreneurs with new or expanding tourism-oriented businesses can now tap into a \$1 million low-interest loan pool managed by The Progress Fund and provided by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and The West Virginia Infrastructure & Jobs Development Council. With this pool of capital, businesses can borrow as much as \$150,000 to cover up to half of a project's costs.

With adjustable rates starting at 4.5 percent that will stay well below prime bank rates, the loan pool can save entrepreneurs significant interest costs. Loans can be applied to real estate acquisition, construction, equipment, working capital, or virtually any other cost associated with starting or growing a business.

"This is a big opportunity for anyone interested in becoming part of West Virginia's growing tourism economy," said David A. Kahley, President & CEO of The Progress Fund. "In light of the USDA's involvement, we're extending a special invitation to those who want to join the agricultural tourism boom, which brings visitors back to the land and farmers into the travel economy."
