"We get a lot of drive-by and pedestrian foot traffic." A year ago, Katie and her new partner Cathy decided to expand into housewares. They didn't want to move Kitchen Kaboodle or dilute its focus, so they opted to open a second store. They settled on an empty office building, which had once been a car wash, but needing capital to cover the rehab costs. They approached various lenders, but one stood out. "We felt the enthusiasm of The Progress Fund and their interest in growing our business was far greater than we saw from the banks," Katie says.

"We saw Kaboodle at Home not only as a job generator and an outlet friendly to locally made products, but as an amenity for mid-state residents," says David A. Kahley, president and CEO of The Progress Fund. "Kitchen Kaboodle's track record gave us confidence in the new store's future." The Fund loaned \$150,000, which went toward a complete renovation of the new location. The new store will employ at least one full-time and four part-time staffers.

The 3,600-square-foot Kaboodle at Home, at 1321 S. Atherton St. in State College, will hold their grand opening April 1 – April 3, 2004. The stylish and functional offerings include flatware, clothing, gift accessories for men and women, barware, travel cases, pet grooming supplies, and much more.
