Since 1988, the Tuscarora Organic Growers
Cooperative has been a model for doing well
by doing good. TOG's member farmers
cooperatively distribute chemical-free, locally
grown produce to Pennsylvania farm stands
and Washington, D.C. gourmets. Over 15
years, they saw their sales increase 30-fold.
Future growth, though, was restricted by their
2,700-square-foot warehouse, and the
financing needed to expand wouldn't grow on
trees. Banks didn't understand the cooperative
business structure, and sought more collateral
than the cooperative had.

Progress:

Luckily, TOG's roles in feeding visitors and exporting product fit right in with The Progress

Fund's effort to stimulate agri-tourism. The Progress Fund agreed to lend \$65,000 for equipment using funds from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The Progress Fund also provided a \$75,000 bridge loan until a state agency could replace that capital.

Impact:

TOG added 3,600 square feet to its warehouse, and now has enough space to dramatically increase shipments, recruit more family farms, and hire more employees. "Projections are that we'll double volume in the next five years," says TOG Manager Chris Fullerton. You can't go wrong with fresh, organic produce — or fresh, local financing.
