### Impact:

Judy says their local supplier community feels like a family. "It's as close to a closed-loop system as you can get," Ed said. The couple gets organic grains from a local farm. Once that grain is spent, he shares it with a sheep farmer, whose rare heritage flock traces its ancestry to historic Mount Vernon. That sheep farmer gives Ed and Judy wool to spin into the yarn they use to hand-tag their bottles. Their care and detail produces some Rebellion-worthy spirits, which you can taste in their rustic downtown taproom.
