By adding a gazebo and a few old-school arcade games, the Kruses are turning a house that sleeps nine into the perfect base for a family getaway or reunion. "There is so much opportunity," says Pam, "for anybody who wants to start a business, from cleaning ladies to landscaping to plumbers to guys that just want to build fire pits."
